



Quarantine **MUST-WATCH**




The coronavirus pandemic has been disastrous unfortunately for the restaurant and bar scene but a boon for TV and streaming services.


Netflix's original series never disappoint. First, The English Game is a stylish period piece set in the late 1800's England and examines how the sport of soccer transformed itself from the pastime of the aristocratic, elite class into a game enjoyed and shared by the masses. Along the way, the six-part limited series gives the viewer a look at English class structure and society.

Next up is *The Spy*. Sasha Baron Cohen is like you have never seen him before in this true story. Set in the turbulent, dangerous Middle East of the 1960s, Cohen takes on the role of a listless, yet happily married department store clerk who joins the Mossad and infiltrates the Syrian military and intelligence establishment. Cohen's character embarks on a tense, audacious mission to obtain critical intelligence about Syrian military activity in order to protect Israel from destruction. Cohen is sure to get attention and support for an Emmy for his performance. Last, Unorthodox is the heartrending tale of a young Hassidic Jewish woman trapped in an unhappy marriage in present-day Brooklyn. The story delves into the common theme of how intense religious faith struggles to reconcile itself with modernity. In an effort to break free from her oppressive environment, the young woman flees to Berlin where she meets a whole new set of challenges.


ESPN's 10-part series *The Last Dance* chronicles the 1997-98 Chicago Bulls' chase for a sixth NBA championship in eight years. The star of the show, of course, is Michael Jordan and features lengthy interview footage of Jordan himself, his teammates, coaches, and family members. Pasta resident recipe By: Cameron & Natalie Kinvig, Resident Contributors

It's the perfect light pasta for summer, and it's super easy to make. We've seen some beautiful heirloom tomatoes at Central Market lately, so we wanted to include a dish that could use them!

INGREDIENTS

3 tablespoons olive oil

3 or more cloves garlic, lightly smashed and peeled

3 or more anchovy fillets

2 lbs heirloom tomatoes, diced

½ cup pitted black olives, preferably oil-cured

2 tablespoons capers

Crushed red pepper flakes to taste

1 pound linguine or other long pasta

Chopped fresh parsley, oregano, marjoram or basil leaves for garnish, optional

Salt and pepper to taste

GRILLED CHICKEN BREAST FOR SERVING PREPARATION

- 1. Bring a pot of water to boil and salt it. Warm 2 tablespoons oil with garlic and anchovies in a skillet over medium-low heat. Cook, stirring occasionally until garlic is lightly golden.
- 2. Drain tomatoes and crush with fork or hands. Add to skillet, with some salt and pepper. Raise heat to medium-high and cook, stirring occasionally, until tomatoes break down and the mixture becomes saucy — about 10 minutes. Stir in olives, capers, and red pepper flakes, and continue to simmer.
- 3. Cook pasta, stirring occasionally until it is tender but not mushy. Drain quickly and toss with sauce and remaining tablespoon of oil. Taste and adjust seasonings as necessary and mix in grilled diced chicken. Garnish with herbs if you like, and serve immediately.

Staring in May, we began rolling out a private neighborhood management system called "PunchAlert" to our block captains. PunchAlert is the all-in-one safety communication solution that will help us to manage security incidents, send announcements, and communicate critical information in real-time.

The most effective crime prevention measures start with us. Each of us notices the cars, people, and activities that don't seem quite right or are actually in the midst of a crime. We have all had that creepy individual knock on our door trying to sell us something or solicit donations. We need to be able to alert one another, quickly, to such incidents.

Today, we as neighbors send an email to me as your AAC chairman. When I see those emails, which arguably is within a

couple of hours, I send a note to Jean Dean asking her to send an announcement to the neighborhood. When she sees that email, again usually in less than an hour, she alerts the neighborhood. The inefficiencies here are obvious.

To further the point, during this year's Halloween festivities, three (3) children went missing. The good news is that our ENP officer, Sergeant Taylor Smith, and his colleagues, found all three children in record time. However, as a parent, those minutes (to an hour) are agonizing. They are also critical. We need to be able to tap into our close-knit community to alert one another, immediately.

Either of these two examples or the numerous others you have shared with me over the past several months merit finding a solution that will empower and enable our neighborhood to look after one another. To alert one another of risky people or situations. To alert 911, our ENP officer and immediate neighbors of a medical emergency. To send basic announcements about upcoming meetings.

I am delighted to announce that this month, we will begin rolling out PunchAlert to every neighbor that wants to participate. The cost to you as neighbors and to the neighborhood is free through September. We are still working on a comprehensive AAC solution for the neighborhood, of which this will certainly be part of the solution. We will have that strategy ready for announcement and vote come September. In the meantime, I hope you will elect to download the application and to participate in our enhanced crime watch efforts.







TEACHING KIDS MONEY SKILLS In An Online World





Want your kids to grow up money-savvy? They will need financial skills to make that happen, and you are their first and most important teacher.




